Italians and Italian Americans have played an instrumental role in the development of Los Angeles as one of the world's greatest cities. This new tour highlights the Italian-inspired treasures around the city and emphasizes the postitive influences the Italian culture has had on the architecture, fashion, art, food, and cinema. In beautiful Old Pasadena. we will visit the City Hall, an iconic and architecturally significant landmark that pays homage to the 16century Italian architect Andrea Palladio. You do not have to travel to Italy to view the great works of Renaissance Masters, but rather visit St Andrew's Church - one of the oldest Catholic parishes in L.A.County and an architectural treasure that dates to 1886. We'll visit Italian Hall - the oldest remaining building from L.A.'s historic Little Italy. At Forest Lawn Memorial Park in Glendale, we will view reproductions of artwork of two of Italy's greatest artists -Leonardo da Vinci's stunning stained glass masterpiece of The Last Supper, and Michelangelo's most famous sculptures - this is the only place in the world where artwork from these legends can be seen together in one location. A highlight of the trip will be a stop at Roma Market in Pasadena. The owner Rosario Mazzeo says his prosciutto is the best in the world. The cured ham hails from San Daniele del Friuli, a mountainous region northeast of Venice, Italy. Roma Market remains a premier destination for specialty Italian food products, offering more than 30 kinds of pasta in myriad shapes and sizes. Searching for a proper panettone? Mazzeo recommends a fig and chestnut flavor he stocks up on for the holidays. Roma's most popular item, however, can be found at the deli counter. Every day, hundreds of people come to the market for Mazzeo's signature sandwich - a "secret recipe" that astute eaters have determined to be a combination of thinly sliced mortadella, capicola, salami and provolone inside a soft white roll. And yes, as part of this tour you will take this delicious Italian sandwich home with you. Enjoy lunch on your own at a true gem if ever there was one - tucked away in a nondescript industrial area of Los Angeles and serving the public for over 100 years is the San Antonio Winery. This cafeteria style restaurant was conceived from a simple idea - provide delicious Italian food in a festive atmosphere. *Locations are subject to change*
